A Day Devoted to Strengthening the Ideals of Peace


The International Day of Peace was established in 1981 by Resolution 36/37 of the United Nations General Assembly. It is a day devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace, both within and among all nations and peoples. To further enhance this mission, the General Assembly adopted Resolution 55/282 in 2001, establishing September 21 as an annual day of non-violence and cease-fire. It is also a global call to action, inviting communities to become peacebuilders, resolving conflict, promoting justice, and fostering understanding. This year’s 2025 theme, “Act Now for a Peaceful World,” reminds us that peace is not passive, it requires courage, commitment, and collective effort.

At Newtown United Methodist Church, the spirit of this day has deep meaning. In 2008, a number of members of this congregation participated in a thirteen-week study entitled *Living the Questions*. As a result of that study, we erected the Peace Pole, which stands at the foot of our driveway and proclaims: “*May Peace Prevail on Earth*” in a number of languages. We have celebrated the International Day of Peace many times since.
