


Fall Bible Study

Mission of the Month

The Mission of the Month (Advance) for September is The Independence Fund, providing programs and services to disabled military veterans who served in combat. Their mobility program empowers amputees to regain their mobility and independence by

using Trackchairs, designed to navigate snow, mud, and dirt. These veterans are able to reenter the outdoors and engage in the activities they enjoy.

CEO Sarah Verardo, a member of Weddington Methodist Church in North Carolina, saw firsthand what a difference Trackchairs could make. Her husband Michael was severely injured when he stepped on an IED while serving in Afghanistan in 2010, losing one of his legs, most of his one arm, and suffering other injuries. He underwent over 100 surgeries. He recently passed away from his injuries at age 40.

The Independence Fund also provides suicide prevention counseling and many other services needed by disabled veterans.


