Note from the Pastor's Desk

Dear NUMC Family,

February arrives carrying two realities at once. Winter still holds the land in its grip; bare trees, long nights, cold mornings, but this month also speaks the language of love. It reminds us that even when warmth feels distant, the heart still knows how to reach, to hope, to endure.

Many of us sense that the world itself feels wintry right now. There is weariness in the air. Headlines weigh heavy. Personal struggles linger longer than we expected. Faith, at times, can feel like a small flame fighting a strong wind.



Scripture is honest about this reality. It never denies the darkness, but it refuses to let darkness have the final word. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it" (John 1:5). Notice what the verse does not say. It does not say the darkness disappears. It says the light remains.

The writer Albert Camus once named a similar truth from another angle:

"In the depth of winter, I finally learned that within me there lay an invincible summer."

Camus was not writing from a place of easy optimism. He understood suffering, absurdity, and the ache of a broken world. Yet, he pointed to something resilient within the human spirit, something winter could not destroy.

Faith speaks of this not as mere resilience, but as life planted by God. Scripture describes it as a light placed within us, a love poured into the heart, a hope that does not depend on circumstances. "We have this treasure in clay jars," Paul writes, "so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us" (2 Corinthians 4:7).

That is why love belongs so naturally in February. Love is not sentimental or seasonal. Love is the steady force that endures when circumstances do not change quickly. Love stays awake in the night. Love believes that what is hidden beneath frozen ground is still alive.

Faith works the same way. It is not always loud or dramatic. Often, it is quiet persistence. Trust that keeps praying. Hope that keeps showing up. A heart that keeps choosing compassion even when the world feels harsh.

You may not feel like spring is near. You may not feel especially strong or joyful. But the promise of faith is not that winter disappears on command, it is that something eternal has already been placed within you. A light no darkness can overcome. A warmth no season can extinguish.

This February, may we tend that inner light. May we practice love not as a holiday gesture, but as a spiritual discipline. And may we trust that even now, especially now, the invincible summer is still alive within us.

Bible Study


Looking Ahead: Interfaith Study Series

Later in January, we will be offering a short interfaith study exploring **Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam, and Christianity**.

As part of the study, we hope to include **guided site visits** to places of worship, such as the **BAPS Swaminarayan Akshardham in New Jersey**, as schedules and opportunities allow.

The study will be held on Tuesdays starting January 27th @ 10:00 AM.



Mission Trip

We have been invited to go to ASP (Appalachian Service Project) for the week of July 19. That is a Sunday. We won't know until May exactly which ASP location we've been assigned to. If need be, we will leave on Saturday to break up the trip. Otherwise, we plan to leave from Jarrettown UMC very early Sunday morning. We head home on Saturday, July 25. We are planning to do that all in one day so I don't have to miss a second Sunday from worship. Jarrettown UMC has a van that holds 15 people. Plus we do our youth group joint with the local Presbyterian Church, and they also have a van we can use. We will need more than one vehicle while down there (one vehicle for every 5-7 participants).

ASP charges \$375 a person for the week (which includes room and board) plus we will also need to cover the cost of travel and incidentals. A \$50 deposit is due by March 31st, payable to Jarrettown UMC. We have reserved 10 spots, first come first serve. If we have more than 10 people who want to go, we have to check with ASP to be sure they still have room. The sooner people register the better!

It is a Methodist vacation and retreat community whose mission is to "provide opportunities for spiritual growth, birth, and renewal in a Christian seaside setting." **Lodging:** There are three first floor, handicapped accessible rooms. Most rooms are on the second and third floors. A limited number of 2nd and 3rd floor rooms have their own bath only. All rooms are double occupancy. **Cost:** Per person, \$200 for shared bath; \$250 for private bath. This covers two nights lodging, continental breakfast on Saturday and Sunday, dinner Saturday, and all retreat materials. The registration deadline is February 22nd 2026 Registration forms are available on the table in the gallery.
